FORMER STFM EMPLOYEE PUBLISHES BOOK BOOK SIGNING NOVEMBER 14

Dr. Cindy Grisham recently published her book "When Hope Grows Weary: Tyronza, Arkansas and Its Place in History." Tyronza residents have been eagerly awaiting its release. Many of the citizens have been used as references in the book by telling family histories, providing photos or just pointing Dr. Grisham in the right direction to research facts about our city.

Dr. Grisham worked as an Arkansas State University graduate assistant at the Southern Tenant Farmers Museum for three years while attaining her doctoral degree. The history of Tyronza was the subject of her dissertation. The book covers the history from the very beginning during the pre-historic Mississippian civilization to modern day Tyronza.

Dr. Grisham's first book, "A Savory History of Arkansas Delta Food" is available for purchase in the museum gift shop. Several locals were mentioned in this book as well. Clara's Midway Café located on Main Street at Tyronza and Whitton Farms at Whitton are featured and photographed several times in the book.

A book reading and signing of "When Hope Grows Weary: Tyronza, Arkansas and Its Place in History" will be held on November 14 at 1:00 p.m. and again at 6:30 p.m. at the Tyronza Senior Center. Dr. Grisham will be available to autograph copies of her book and discuss any topics covered in the books.

Jessica Ross is a native of Tyronza and a recent graduate of Arkansas State University. She too will be working 20 hours a week.



The Southern Tenant Farmers Museum and the Poinsett County Farm Bureau have teamed up to create the Poinsett County Farm Life Photo Contest. Students in all Poinsett County Schools in grades 9-12 are eligible to enter the contest.

Photos must be 5x7 in print and can be of anything farm related—crops, animals, flowers, gardens, produce, farmers, equipment, etc. The top ten from each school will be selected and displayed on the 3rd floor of the Arkansas State University Library during December where they will be judged by a member of the Thea Foundation from Little Rock. The exhibit will return to STFM in January and on January 18th there will be a reception and cash awards for the winners. Cash prizes provided by Farm Bureau are \$100 for 1st place, \$75 for 2nd place and \$50 for 3rd place.
