Military Mommy to be Presented



Although Suzanne is a needle worker, she is not a quilter. But she admires and appreciates the love and hours of dedication that go into each quilt. Suzanne Churchill is a life-long resident of Jonesboro, a graduate of Jonesboro High School and earned a BS in Commercial Art from ASU. She has continued her art education by attending numerous workshops. After working for several years as a graphic artist in printing and publishing, she began doing commissioned painting, working from her home studio.

Suzanne currently works full-time in her studio. A large part of her business comes from her internet sales of commissioned watercolor house portraits. 2011 Quilt Show

The 4th annual STFM Quilt Show will be held on March 5, 2011, beginning at 9 a.m. Started by STFM in 2008 in recognition of Women's History Month, the show will partner with the Sunken Lands Regional Chamber of Commerce to create a trail for quilt enthusiasts to travel that will include Dyess, Lepanto, Marked Tree, Tyronza, and Harrisburg.

Quilts in Tyronza will be displayed at STFM, First Baptist Church, Church of Christ and Tyronza Elementary. Other locations may be added later. Anyone wishing to display a quilt may contact any of the locations. STFM is requesting baby quilts for a special display at the museum but can assist in the display of full size quilts as well.

Classes in hand piecing, quilting, appliqué, and constructing yo-yos will be held in various locations throughout Tyronza. The hand quilting class will feature a quilt pieced by our graduate assistant, Anita Reddig. Each class participant will have the opportunity to quilt it as well as learn the proper techniques for layering the top, batting, and backing. A label will be attached to the back with each quilter's name on it. The finished project will be raffled off to raise money for next year's show. There will be a \$5 materials fee for all classes.

Marjorie Hunter of Marion, AR, will be back this year to teach classes and to present a lecture on the underground railroad titled "Codes in the Quilts." The lecture has been very popular for the past two years and many have requested that it be presented again.

Tyronza's Historic "Red Square"

In 1931, two Tyronza residents applied for and received a charter to organize a chapter of the Socialist Party. The Tyronza Socialist Party was the first in the state and one of the first in the South. Political rallies and regular scheduled meetings of the Socialist Party were held at the Odd Fellow Lodge in Tyronza. The 1932 Arkansas Socialist Party Convention was held in a big tent on the ball field in Tyronza with Norman Thomas, candidate for President of the United States as the featured speaker. Local residents began to refer to the corner of Main Street and Highway 63 (now Frisco Street) where a dry cleaners and gas station were located as "Red Square." Those buildings now house the **Southern Tenant Farmers Museum**.
